Accommodations

Yellow Springs boasts one bed & breakfast, with a grand total of four rooms. The Morgan House, 120 E. Limestone, is easy walking distance to the meeting rooms and to local hostels. Costs for a single room are \$35/night, for a double \$40, and for a double with twin beds \$50. All prices include breakfast. Phone (513) 767-7509.

The closest hotel is the Anthony Wayne, 3601 Rte 68, a scruffy but serviceable road house a stone's throw (about a mile) from the meeting rooms. Cost: single or double \$17.99. They do not accept reservations. Once you get into town call (513) 767-9004.

A fifteen-minute drive away is a Holiday Inn, 2800 Presidential Way, Fairborn, Ohio. Thursday night: Single \$72.00, double \$75.00. Friday and Saturday nights: Single \$39.95, double \$45.95. Phone (513) 426-7800. The Holiday Inn is about a mile from Wright Field.

A variety of other hotels are available at similar driving distances. Call the organizers for details.

On Sunday morning we will be having country breakfast at the Clifton Mill, a working 19th century water-powered mill a few miles east of Yellow Springs. The food is inexpensive and excellent, and the dining room looks out over the millrace. On the way back we can take a leisurely walk through the gorge of the Little Miami River (a National Scenic River). If you would like to go to Sunday breakfast please let us know: we need a headcount.

Distances

Yellow Springs is 10 minutes from the Clifton Mill, 20 minutes from Wright Field (Wright-Patterson AFB), 35 minutes from the Dayton airport, and about 90 minutes from Cincinnati and Columbus.
