

## **Across**

- 2.** Trinity College's men team holds the record for the longest unbeaten streak in any intercollegiate sport.
- 4.** This is the most popular sport in the world, being played in more than 200 countries!
- 6.** This sport's longest match occurred in 1939 between England and South Africa, which ended in a tie after 14 days.
- 7.** This game was originally used to toughen up young men for war, focusing also on the spiritual side.
- 9.** Coming from the French word 'tenez,' popular events include The U.S. Open, the French Open, and Wimbledon.
- 10.** This sport used to be called 'mintonette,' and is the second most popular sport in the world!
- 11.** A perfect game in this sport is a score of 300.
- 12.** Peach baskets were first used as hoops in this sport, where officials would have to get the ball out after each basket.
- 14.** In this sport, men compete in 6 events, while women compete in four.
- 18.** According to mythology, Zeus became ruler of the Earth when he defeated Cronus in this sport.
- 19.** This is the fastest racquet sport in the world, with shuttlecock speeds reaching more than 200 mph.

- 13.** The name of this sport is made up of 3 Chinese/Korean words: 'to kick or jump', 'fist or hand', and 'the way'.
- 15.** As of 2016, Michael Phelps has 28 Olympic medals in this sport!
- 16.** This sport evolved from soccer and rugby, and the first game ever played was in 1869.
- 17.** The New York Yankees have won 26 World Series titles in this sport, which is more than any other team.
